

FRED HOLLOWS FUNDRAISER NEXT THURSDAY 15th April- DRESS UP FOR YOUR FUTURE CAREER

Fred Hollows is one of our famous former pupils. Each year we like to remember his work by holding a fundraiser for the Fred Hollows Foundation. Children can come dressed up in a way that shows what they want to do in the future. We will hold a parade at 10.15. We ask for a donation from the whanau of a gold coin. Here is what the Foundation works towards:

"The Fred Hollows Foundation works in more than 25 countries and has restored sight to over two million people worldwide. This has been achieved with the overwhelming support of our donors. Like Fred, we're deeply committed to ending avoidable blindness. Four out of five people who are blind don't need to be, and while we've achieved so much, we still have a long way to go.

Fred wouldn't have stopped until he put an end to avoidable blindness, and neither will we. We continue to train eye doctors and nurses, raise money for essential equipment and medical facilities, and perform eye surgeries just like the ones Fred himself performed over 30 years ago.

We're restoring sight and restoring lives. After their eye sight is saved patients are able to return to work or school and provide for their families. Fred believed that good eye care was the right of everybody and it's with his ethos in mind that we won't hold back until we end avoidable blindness in the Pacific".
